Water from the Rock Exodus 17:1-7	Jesus as Living Water John 4:13-14

THE TORN CURTAIN

In the Old Testament, we read about the temple in Jerusalem. In the temple, the presence of God himself dwelt in the "Holy of Holies," which was separated from the rest of the temple by a curtain. Only the High Priest once a year could enter the "Holy of Holies." The curtain represented a separation between humanity and God because of sin. Notice what happened at the very moment that Jesus died! See Matthew 27:51.

Hundreds of Old Testament passages, stories, and images foreshadow ESUS

The New Testament writers saw Jesus in various ways beyond direct prophecy. They used typological figures, concrete images, narrative patterns, and specific words to connect Jesus with the Old Testament. This multi-layered approach reveals a deep theological understanding and invites reflection on God's unified plan of redemption.
